



Regional Supervisor

The Community FoodBank of NJ is looking for five Regional Supervisors to oversee the planning and delivery of a grant funded nutrition education program at multiple sites in an assigned service area as determined by the Director. This role will report directly to the Director.

The ideal candidate will be someone who has the ability to directly supervise a team of nutrition educators and provide effective team development as well as corrective action.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Direct supervision and oversight for a regional team of nutrition educators
- Provide training on up-dates to nutrition education curricula and state program guidelines
- Assist in meeting the nutrition education program goals by delivering health promotion efforts to target audiences that promote:
 - Physical activity
 - Healthy food choices
 - Engaging in a healthy lifestyle on a budget
 - Decreasing the risk of nutrition related chronic diseases
- Assist in development, planning, and implementation of nutrition education and related activities for multiple programs, including but not limited to:
 - Direct Nutrition Education Class Series:
 - Cooking Matters (youth + adult)
 - Eating Smart, Being Active (Adults)
 - Heart Smarts (youth + adult)
 - Cent\$ible Nutrition Program (adults)
 - Eat Smart, Live Strong (Older adults)
 - Harvest of the Month (youth + adults)
 - Policy Systems & Environmental Change:
 - Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child
 - Early Care & Education Learning Collaborative
 - Faithfully Fit (direct education + train-the-trainer)
 - Healthy Corner Store Initiative
- Represent the program and CFBNJ and participate in health fairs for agencies and organizations as requested
- Develop and cultivate partnerships with non-profit, governmental and corporate organizations

Qualified candidates will have Bachelor of Science in Nutritional Science/Dietetics along with 5 years of supervision and project management experience. Bi-lingual language skills (English and Spanish/Creole) is a plus. Candidates must be at ease with public speaking and be comfortable working with youth and adults in limited resource communities. This position will have a varied work schedule that includes nights and weekends to meet the scheduling needs of partnering organizations and schools. Applicants must have a car as travel to various sites is required along with the capability to carry bulk materials as necessary; up to about 40 lbs. Technical aptitude (Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint) is essential for success, along with a positive, can-do attitude, excellent communication and interpersonal skills, a high degree of self-motivation.
